SOS 101 Introduction to Sociology I

ECTS: 5

Basic concepts of sociology, Subject and purpose of sociology, Theories in sociology, Methods and techniques used by sociology, Individual and society, Identity and socialization, Concept of culture, Cultural change, Approaches to family and family, Education and society, Sociology in Turkey, Turkish sociologists.

SOS 103 Introduction to Philosophy

ECTS: 5

The meaning of philosophy, its scope, What is philosophy?, Philosophy of Knowledge, Philosophy of Science, Philosophy of Being, Philosophy of Morality, Philosophy of Political, Philosophy of History, Philosophy of Law, Philosophy of Art, Philosophy of Religion, Philosophy of Education.

PSK 101 Introduction to Psychology

ECTS: 5

The definition of psychology, its basic fields, concepts, historical development of psychology, sensation and perception, development, personality theories, psychopathology will be covered.

SOS 107 Introduction to Law

ECTS: 4

Constitutional features of the Republic of Turkey, citizenship rights, use of fundamental rights and freedoms, knowledge of civil law, constitutional law and administrative law, content of family law, concepts, inheritance relations, debt and credit relations.

SOS 109 Social Anthropology

ECTS: 5

What is anthropology? Approach and principles of anthropology, methods and techniques of anthropology, what is culture? Cultural processes, approaches to culture, basic anthropological theories, the place of man in the living world, pre-industrial adaptation and lifestyles, city, state and industry, the spread of economic inequality, underdevelopment and the third world, kinship and gender, Religion, Language.

ING 101 English I

ECTS: 2

It is a basic course of learning English and its main purpose is to teach students to use your vocabulary and language rules in a practical way based on four skills. This course is more based on reading, comprehension, speaking and writing including basic English.

ATA 101 Ataturk's Principles and History of Turkish Revolution I**ECTS: 2**

Basic Concepts, Ottoman Empire and Renewal Movements in the Ottoman Empire, Reasons for the Decline of the Ottoman Empire, Young Ottomans, Constitutional Monarchy, Union and Progress Constitutional Period, Tripoli and Balkan War, World War I: The Causes of the War, The Fronts Against the Ottoman Empire, Secret Treaties, Results of the War, Armistice of Mudros and Sharing of the Ottoman State, National Struggle: Preparation Period, Societies, National Forces, Congresses: Regional Congresses, Erzurum Congress, Sivas Congress Last Ottoman Parliamentary Assembly and Misak-ı Milli, Opening of the Grand National Assembly and Formation of the New Turkish State, Fronts in the National Struggle: Eastern, Southern and Western Fronts, Armistice of Mudanya and Treaty of Lausanne.

TUR 101 Turkish Language I**ECTS: 2**

History and basic rules of Turkish, reading exemplary literary and scientific texts.

SOS 102 Introduction to Sociology II**ECTS: 5**

Research methods and techniques in sociology, scientific research process in sociology, family and society, education and society, religion and society, economy and society, politics and society, sociological theories of urbanization and urbanization, migration and society, social deviation and crime, sociology of aging.

SOS 104 Sociology of Institutions**ECTS: 4**

Social Structure, Social Institutions, Economic Institution, Political Institution, Educational Institution, Family Institution, Religious Institution, Legal Institution, Leisure Time Institution, Health as a Social Institution, Sports Institution.

SOS 106 Introduction to Economics**ECTS: 5**

Students will be introduced to the basic concepts of economics in micro-economic terms, the distinction between micro-macroeconomics and different approaches in economics, different types of markets, concepts of supply and demand, elasticity of supply and demand, theory of consumer behavior, production and cost concepts will be explained. In macroeconomic terms, macroeconomic principles and policies, basics of macroeconomics, measurement of macroeconomic activities, aggregate demand, aggregate supply curves and macroeconomic analysis, Fundamentals of Classical and Keynesian macroeconomics, Tools of Simple Keynesian aggregate demand theory and determination of national income, content and history of money, economics of money. effects on inflation, employment, unemployment and inflation, economic fluctuations and economic growth will be explained.

SOS 108 Classical Logic**ECTS: 5**

What is logic?, reasoning and principles of reason, history of logic, logic of concepts, types of concepts, intension and scope, definition and structure of proposition, types of propositions and distribution of terms in propositions, what is syllogism?, definition and structure of syllogism, types of syllogism, philosophy of logic, applications of logic.

SOS 110 Educational Sociology**ECTS: 5**

Subject, definition, characteristics, development of Educational Sociology. Relationship of Educational Sociology with other sciences. socialization process. Goals and society in education. Social functions of education. Culture and education relations. Equal Opportunity in Education. Family and education. Education culture relations. Democracy, economy and education. Social stratification and education. Social change and education. Instructional Sociology.

TUR 102 Turkish Language II**ECTS: 2**

Sentence structures in Turkish and examples of conflicting practices with these structures, comprehension-expression practices, general characteristics of writing types.

ATA 102 Atatürk's Principles and History of Revolution II**ECTS: 2**

Political Revolutions: Abolition of the Sultanate, Proclamation of the Republic, Abolition of the Caliphate, Constitutional Movements, Attempts to Transition to Multi-Party Life, Revolutions Made in the Field of Law and the New Legal Order, Revolutions Made in the Field of Education and Culture, Revolutions Made in the Social Field, Revolutions Made in the Economic Field, Atatürk Era Turkish Foreign Policy (1923-1938), Atatürk's Principles: Republicanism, Nationalism, Populism, Statism, Secularism, Revolutionism, Integrative Principles, Turkey After Atatürk (Domestic and Foreign Political Developments).

ING 102 English II**ECTS: 2**

English II course is a continuation of English I education and is a compulsory course at A1-A2 (beginner-upper) level. In this course, in addition to the parts of the three language skills (reading, writing, listening), it is aimed that students have basic English communication skills with language structures that people can use in life.

KRP 102 Career Planning**ECTS: 2**

The Career Planning course is taught within the framework of the draft created by the Presidential Human Resources Office, with videos and activities prepared for each week, and guest trainers invited from university lecturers, industry professionals, non-governmental organizations and international organizations. The supportive activities to be included in the course are designed to inform students about the methods and tools used in professional applications and to enable them to use them in the most effective way, and are supported by practical activities. Antalya AKEV University Career Center will follow the course in practice with activities that provide experience opportunities that will support students to develop their skills.

SECOND YEAR**SOS 201 History of Sociology I****ECTS: 5**

The birth of sociology as a science, developments that influenced the birth of sociology, sociological positivism, early developments in sociology, Saint-Simon, Auguste Comte, Herbert Spencer, Basic approaches in Classical Sociology: Karl Marx, Emile Durkheim and Max Weber, Simmel, Pareto, Western Marxism Gramsci and Lukacs.

SOS 203 Family Sociology**ECTS: 5**

Basic concepts of family sociology, Types of family, Methods and theories in family sociology, Sociological discussions on the future of the family, Transformation of the family from past to present in Turkey, Family and education, Marriage, Divorce and New Family Forms, Family and Child, Kinship, Family social control and change.

SOS 205 History of Philosophy I**ECTS: 5**

Ancient Philosophy - Greek Philosophy, the birth of philosophy, natural philosophy, human philosophy, the systematic period of Greek philosophy - Plato- Aristotle, Hellenism - Roman Philosophy, moral period, the period of reconciliation between philosophical epochs, Roman Philosophy - New Skepticism - religious

period, Medieval Philosophy - scholastic philosophy, the first period of scholasticism, the rise of scholasticism, the last period of scholasticism.

PSK 201 Social Psychology

ECTS: 5

Definition of social psychology, its historical development and current research topics in social psychology; Methods and examples used in social psychology research; Social Influence and Adaptation: Sherif's "Group Norm Formation" and Asch's "Conformity" experiments, Milgram's "Obedience" and Zimbardo's "Stanford Prison" experiments; Factors affecting conformity behavior, norms and conceptualization of conformity behaviors, current studies in this field; Social Cognition: Social perception and cognitive processes, Attribution theory; Attitudes: Elements of attitudes, theory of planned behavior; Development and stereotyping of attitudes, measurement of attitudes; Theoretical approaches to the change of attitudes; Festinger's Cognitive Dissonance Theory; Socialization and Social Development: Moral Development, aggression, prosocial behavior and helping behavior; Interpersonal attraction.

SOS 207 Modern Logic

ECTS: 5

Development of classical logic after Aristotle, establishment of propositional calculus, checking propositions with truth table, checking propositions with analytic table, validity-consistency-equivalence, propositional logic - quantification logic, inadequacy of truth function logic, basic concepts in quantification logic, truth value in quantification logic calculus, control with analytic table in quantization logic, symbolization – Turkish equivalents of logical invariants, truth function and symbolization in quantization logic, symbolization and control.

SOS 209 Demography

ECTS: 5

Nature of demography, types of demography. Demography, sciences and sociology. Population theories: Historical process, Mercantilists, Physiocrats, Malthus and later. Demographic transformation theory, Basic concepts and measures of demography, Migration and its theories. Structural and numerical change of world population. Population pyramids. Population-economy. Population-education. Population-family. Population policies.

SOS 202 History of Sociology II

ECTS: 5

Functionalism-Parsons, Merton, Davis and Moore, Erikson, Smelser, New Functionalism-Luhmann and Alexander/ Conflict Theory-Wright Mills, Coser, Dahrendorf/ Symbolic Interactionism- Cooley, Mead, Blummer/ Phenomenology/ Ethnomethodology/ Frankfurt School/ Structuralism.

SOS 204 History of Philosophy II

ECTS: 5

The beginning of modern philosophy, the age of free metaphysics, Giordano Bruno, Camporeale, Francis Bacon, Hobbes, Descartes, Spinoza, Leibniz. The age of criticism and its philosophy. Locke, Berkeley, Condillac, the advancement of materialist philosophy, Hume, Kant, Kant and German idealism, Fichte, Schelling, Hegel, Herbart, Schopenhauer, Positivism and New Criticism.

PSK 206 Developmental Psychology

ECTS: 5

Subject and purpose of Developmental Psychology, Development Theories, Genetics and Environment, Reproductive Difficulties, Prenatal Development Periods, Birth-Newborn Adaptation Process, Physical Cognitive and Socio-emotional Development in Infancy, Attachment Theories, Early Childhood, Physical, Cognitive and Socio-emotional Development, Middle and Late Childhood Physical, Cognitive and Socioemotional Development, Moral Theories in Developmental Psychology, The Role of Brain and Temperament in Development, cognitive, physical and social development of adolescence and adulthood.

SOS 208 Rural Sociology**ECTS: 5**

Definition and development of rural sociology, methods used by rural sociology, social change in the village, village family system, village education system, village observation trip, village religious systems, village health systems, population movements in the village, observation trip in the village, management system in the village, in terms of social development importance of the village.

SOS 210 Methods and Techniques in Sociology I**ECTS: 5**

Paradigm/Method understandings in sociology. Types of Sociological Research (Historical comparative research, Field research, Survey /Survey). Research design: Nature of Research and Ethics, Qualitative Research Method; Research Proposal, Research Content. Quantitative Research Method, Research Proposal, Research Content, Universe-Sample Relationship, Sample Types, Mixed Research Method.

SOS 212 Statistics**ECTS: 5**

This course aims to explain the basic statistical methods in the context of current data in the field of Sociology. Introduction to Statistics, data, parameters, variables, measurement; Frequency distributions, classification and grouping; Central Tendency (arithmetic mean, mode, median) and measures of variability (standard deviation, variance, range of variation); Discrete and continuous random variables. The concept of normal distribution, its properties; Hypothesis testing and related concepts, t and Z tests; Analysis of Variance; Correlation and Regression Analysis; Non-parametric tests. In addition, students will be introduced to the SPSS program and the application of all methods will be carried out with SPSS.

THIRD YEAR**SOS 301 Urban Sociology****ECTS: 5**

City and urban types, Urbanization-urbanization-migration phenomenon, Urban theories; Urban theories in Europe, urban theories in America, City and space, Urban social movements, Urban politics and local governments, The city in old Turkish societies.

SOS 303 Sociology of Law**ECTS: 5**

Philosophical foundations of law, Sociological foundations of law, Pioneers of sociological legal thought; Aristotle, Ibn Khaldun, Montesquieu, Jeremy Bentham. Those who make up the sociological thought of law: Saint-Simon, A. Comte, E. Durkheim, K. Marx, L. Althusser, E. Ehrlich, M. Weber, G. Gurvitch, N. Luhman, D. Black. Law according to Society Types; models of law in slave, feudal and industrial societies; Modernism, Postmodernism, Feminism. Crime and Punishment; Crime and punishment in sociological terms, Foucault; crime and punishment, women and punishment. Constitutional state; Concepts of the state of law, social-law state.

SOS 305 Political Philosophy**ECTS: 5**

Based on the basic concepts of political science, the relationship between philosophy and politics, politics in Greek philosophy, the political views of Plato, Aristotle and Epicurus, the Church and politics in medieval theology, St. Augustinos, St. Thomas, the political philosophy of Leibniz, the political tension of the Middle Ages, Relationship between modernity and politics, Bodin, Machiavelli, Spinoza, Hobbes, Locke's political philosophy, Montesquieu, Hume, Rousseau, Condorcet, Kant's views, Politics and historical forces (19th century), Political action and history, Renouvier, J.S. Mill, Hegel, A. Comte, Fichte, S. Simon, Proudhon, Marx, 20th century and later - republic and democracy understanding will be discussed.

SOS 307 Methods and Techniques in Sociology II**ECTS: 5**

Research Techniques: Observation, Interview, Focus Group Interview, Questionnaire technique and its applications. Research report (Features of the report, principles to be applied in its writing, reference, citation, citation, etc.) Sociologists and their methods (Durkheim, Weber, Marx, Ezra Park, Glaser and Strauss; Grounded theory, P. Bourdieu, H. Garfinkel and Ethnomethodology, Dorothy Smith and the Feminist method, Mübeccel Kiray, Wacquant etc.).

SOS 309 Social Change (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

After the definition of the concept of change in sociological terms is given, the basic concepts of socio-cultural change such as enculturation, acculturation, forced acculturation, assimilation and socio-cultural integration are emphasized and information is given about the formation stages of the said change. In addition, the perspectives of classical and modern theories on the phenomenon of change are examined.

SOS 311 Economic Sociology (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

The aim and subject of economic sociology, the emergence and development of economic thought in the east and west, the stages of economic thought in ancient Greece, feudalism and industrial societies and the currents representing these stages constitute the content of the course. In addition, current issues such as globalization and its effects, poverty, informal economy and entrepreneurship are also covered within the scope of the course.

PSK 315 Learning Psychology (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

Basic concepts and principles related to learning, factors affecting development and learning, development and learning theories.

SOS 315 Tourism Sociology (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

The birth, development and general framework of tourism sociology, the background of tourism sociology, the emergence and development of leisure and recreation concepts, socio-cultural and environmental effects of tourism development, culture and tourism interaction, business-labor market in tourism, globalization and tourism, social justice-social inequality and tourism, performance and body in tourism, sociological approaches in tourism.

SOS 317 Sociological Text Readings (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

Understanding and discussing the content of the relevant chapters from selected books that have become sociological texts.

SOS 319 Civil Society and Democracy (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

The concept of civil society, the position of civil society in the historical process, the elements / structures / organizations that make up civil society. Existence conditions of democracy, types of democracy, experiences of democracy in the historical process, human rights and democracy, State-civil society relationship, Relationship between civil society and democracy.

SOS 302 Communication Sociology**ECTS: 5**

Social Communication: Sociology and communication, Communication and society, Social communication models; Mass Communication: Quality, Public Opinion, Theories, Spiral of Silence, Technological determinism, Simulation theory, N. Chomsky and the manufacture of public opinion, H. Schiller and Mentalists, etc. media reality; media and ideology, media and democracy, media ethics, media literacy,

media and advertising, media and violence, media and culture, etc., mass communication and globalization. Electronic Communication, Traditional and alternative media, social networks, social media.

SOS 304 Political Sociology

ECTS: 5

Concepts and approaches in political sociology, subject of political sociology, politics, power and state, authority-legitimacy and political system, types of authority and legitimacy, dependence and relative autonomy of politics, rediscovery of politics, elite theory and determining politics, politics and power relations, politics sociological analysis, historical sociology and the Marxist tradition, relativism in political sociology, modernity and postmodernism.

SOS 306 Qualitative Methods and Techniques

ECTS: 5

The philosophical dimension of the Qualitative Method; hermeneutics, Sociological dimension: Interpretive paradigm, Approaches: Phenomenology, Ethnomethodology, Grounded theory, Characteristics of the qualitative method, Proposal preparation, Research designs; Narrative, Phenomenological Theory, Ethnography, Case study. Qualitative data collection techniques: Observation, Interview, Focus group, Oral history. Qualitative data analysis techniques: Content analysis, discourse analysis, discourse analysis models, Foucauldian discourse analysis, Critical discourse analysis and application examples: Ruth Wodak, van Dijk, Norman Fairclough.

SOS 308 Information Sociology (Elective Course)

ECTS: 5

Philosophical foundations of knowledge, philosophy of science, sociology of knowledge as a sub-discipline of sociology, precursors of sociology of knowledge (Ibn Khaldun, F. Bacon), contributors to sociology of knowledge (Saint-Simon, Comte, Durkheim, Marx, Weber, Mannheim, Gurwitsch, Bourdieu, P. Berger, Habermas). Turkey: Ziya Gökalp, Sabri Ülgener. Some subjects and concepts in terms of sociology of knowledge; Sociological knowledge, ideology, Intellectual and Intellectual, Information society.

SOS 310 Environmental Sociology (Elective Course)

ECTS: 5

The course is divided into two main parts. In the first part, the basic features and principles of the approaches developed on the environment, and their perspectives on the interaction of the individual-nature-society are examined. In the second part of the course, within the framework of the foundations created in parallel with the first part, students are asked to conduct a research focused on a basic environmental problem and make a presentation.

SOS 312 Sociology of Art and Literature (Elective Course)

ECTS: 5

The scope, dimensions, historicity of art sociology, the task of art, the relationship between art and society. Discussion of the field, aims and problems of the sociology of literature. Historical development of the sociology of literature. Basic sociological approaches. Basic dynamics in author-society-work interaction. Analyzing sociological elements by examining literary works.

PSK 214 Education Psychology (Elective Course)

ECTS: 5

Education-Psychology relationship, definition and functions of educational psychology, basic concepts related to learning and development, developmental characteristics (physical, cognitive, emotional, social and moral development), learning theories, reflections of learning theories on teaching processes, effective learning, factors affecting learning.

SOS 314 International Migration and Refugee (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

The temporal and spatial patterns of the causes of individual, group and mass migration events in national and international dimensions, structures of migration, groups and societies participating in migration, sending and receiving migration, political, cultural and economic relations between them, determinants of migration, macro-micro approaches, globalization, It focuses on migration and the contradictions-problems it creates, poverty and the contradictions it creates.

SOS 316 Social Stratification (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

Thoughts on social stratification, forms of social stratification, classical stratification theories, contemporary stratification theories, stratification in today's societies (social stratification dimensions, social stratification and life chances, life style and social stratification), social mobility.

FOURTH YEAR**SOS 401 Contemporary Sociological Theories I****ECTS: 5**

Social theory, structural functionalism, conflictism, symbolic interactionism, dramaturgy, ethnomethodology, phenomenology, critical theory, social construction of reality, social exchange theory, new functionalism, communicative action theory.

SOS 403 Criminal Sociology**ECTS: 5**

Deviation and Crime: E. Durkheim, R. Merton, E. Goffman, Deviance and crime. Criminology; Its scope, history, theories, criminology and sociology. Sociological theories of crime: Durkheim and Functionalist theory, R. Merton and Tension theory, Chicago School, Labeling, Marxist theory, Organized crime theories. Criminality in Turkey: Criminal Case, Statistics, Researches, Juvenile Delinquency; Concepts, theories, juvenile delinquency in Turkey, Juvenile Courts, Child poverty. female guilt; historical situation, theories, female delinquency in Turkey, female poverty. Probation; Meaning, scope, history, International decisions, legal situation, Probation Organization structure in Turkey, Statistics and researches.

SOS 405 Turkish Sociology History**ECTS: 5**

The birth and development of sociology in Turkey, Ahmet Şuayb, Prince Sabahattin, Ziya Gökalp, Mehmet İzzet, Ziyaeddin Fahri Fındıkoğlu, Mehmet Ali Şevki Sevündık, İsmayan Hakkı Baltacıoğlu, Hilmi Ziya Ülken, Niyazi Berkes, Behice Boran, İbrahim Yasa, Mübeccel Kıray, Cahit Tanyol, Mumtaz Turhan, Cemil Meriç, Baykan Sezer, Şerif Mardin.

SOS 407 Ethnography (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

What is ethnography? Features, purpose, places of use. Theoretical foundations of ethnography, method, types, basic concepts, features of ethnographic research. Examining cultural groups, human and cultural relations, examples of ethnography.

SOS 409 Project Preparation Techniques (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

Methods of scientific project preparation, ethics in project preparation, project types and content, project institutions, case studies, literature review and evaluation in project preparation, originality and capability problem, characteristics of project writing, content and writing rules of projects. Each student chooses a project topic, scans the literature, prepares the project proposal, works in accordance with the project, and the work done every week is evaluated in the classroom. The data collection techniques learned in the

method courses are applied. The data is collected and organized in such a way that it will come to the writing stage.

SOS 411 Gender Sociology (Elective Course)

ECTS: 5

Gender and gender, the importance of gender for sociology with a feminist perspective, gender discussions, gender and politics, gender and development, production-reproduction and labor, social policy and gender, gender and urban policy, gender and media, violence against women, gender and body politics, masculinity studies, the history of the Turkish feminist movement, methods and techniques in feminist research.

SOS 413 Cinema and Sociology (Elective Course)

ECTS: 5

The relationship between cinema and society, a brief history of studies examining this relationship, cinema as a mass media and a social institution, the place of cinema in mass culture, assimilation of the cinema-society relationship: the social content of films; content analysis and cultural values. An exemplary study examining the cinema-society relations: The Changing Profile of the People Migrating to the City in Turkish Cinema. Understanding the ideology of a movie, signs and their ideological meanings. Case study: Women in Turkish cinema, Hollywood cinema and war, Globalization, National Identity and Turkish Cinema. Presentation of students' work.

SOS 415 Sociology of Social Movements (Elective Course)

ECTS: 5

Classical sociologists and social movements, The nature of old social movements and sociological approaches. The nature of new social movements. Types of new social movements; women's movement, environmental movement, urban movements, religious movements etc. State and social movements.

SOS 417 Sociology of Ethnicity and Minorities (Elective Course)

ECTS: 5

Ethnicity, ethnic group, ethnic identity, collective identity, national identity, culture and cultural identity, assimilation/integration and minority/majority concepts, Objective and subjective elements of ethnicity, Emic and ethical ethnicity, Theoretical approaches to ethnicity, The impact of the globalization process on ethnic groups, status of minority groups, perceptions of us and the other.

SOS 402 Contemporary Sociological Theories II

ECTS: 5

Anthony Giddens-Structuration Theory, Bourdieu, Postmodern Theory, Post-Industrial Society-Daniel Bell, Alain Touraine, Zygmunt Bauman: Modernity and Postmodernity, Consumer Society, Simulation/Simulark and the Silent Majority-Jean Baudrillard, Post-Structuralism- Foucault and Derrida, Derrida Wallersteinu - World System Theory, Postmarxism.

SOS 404 Social Structure of Turkey

ECTS: 5

The economic and social structure in the Ottoman Empire, the legacy of Ottoman modernization, the road to the Republic, the political and economic structure in Turkey, demographics and health as their appearance in the change of social and cultural structure, family as the aspects of social structure and culture, social structure of Turkey and education urbanization, working life and problems from its appearance in the change of social and cultural structure.

SOS 406 Graduation Thesis

ECTS: 5

The project topics that the students took in the "SOS 409 Project Preparation Techniques" course in the seventh semester are completed and written together with the bibliography in accordance with the spelling rules. It is presented to his friends as a seminar in the class. The project file is delivered to the course instructor.

SOS 408 Disability Sociology (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

What is disability? Disability, disability, disorder, disease conceptualizations. Disability and the body. forms of disability; physical, mental, emotional etc. Disability and old age. SOS 410 Sociology of Health (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

Culture, health-disease relationship, health policies in Turkey, The relationship of diseases with the social structure of society. Culture, health-disease relationship, Poverty, unemployment, divorce, health-disease relationship of social phenomena such as violence, Organizational-administrative structure of hospitals and health institutions. Doctors, nurses, dietitians, etc. health personnel.

SOS 412 Art Philosophy (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

The relationship between art and philosophy, Different philosophical views on the explanation of art, What is beautiful, Beautiful in art and nature, Different philosophical approaches in the context of the criteria of beauty and the source of beauty, Art work and its qualities, Different philosophical approaches about art and art.

SOS 414 Aging and Society (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

Introduction to the sociology of aging, Causes and consequences of aging, Theories of aging, Social welfare state and aging policies, Social aspects of aging, Field Studies: Status of the elderly generation in Turkey, Migration and intergenerational solidarity in Turkey, Strategies for coping with aging.

SOS 416 Sociology of Religion (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

Subject and scope of sociology of religion, Other sciences (history of religions, anthropology etc.), Phenomenon of religion: Etymology, meaning. Approaches/theories to the phenomenon of religion: Durkheim, Sigmund Freud, L. Feurbach, K. Marx, M. Weber, Joachim Wach, Gustav Menching, Peter Berger. Views on Religious Groups: Durkheim, M. Weber, J. Wach, G. Menching, M. Taplamacioğlu. Method in Sociology of Religion: Quantitative Method, Qualitative Method: Hermeneutics, Interpretive/interpretive paradigm, Phenomenology, Process and research proposal in religious group research. Religious group analysis examples.

SOS 418 Everyday Life Sociology (Elective Course)**ECTS: 5**

Within the scope of this course, the meaning of the concept of daily life, the theories of daily life sociology, the important names of these theories, the relations between space and daily life and leisure, consumption and daily life are discussed.
